Hedge Fund Guided Portfolio Solution Strategy Highlights

Performance summary

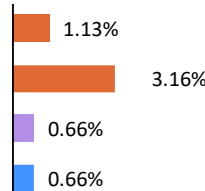
Hedge Fund Guided Portfolio Solution (the "Fund," "Hedge Fund GPS", "HFGPS") generated positive returns in the first quarter of 2024. Global equity market indices continued their positive trend from the previous year and delivered three consecutive months of gains in the first quarter of 2024, which was supported by a resilient global economy. U.S. indices outperformed global indices with the S&P 500 and MSCI World returning +10.6 and +9.0%, respectively. U.S. equities generated positive performance as the strength and the stability of the economy and growing enthusiasm for AI opportunities boosted investor confidence. Stocks across all but one sector posted positive results with the communication services, energy, information technology, financials, and industrials sectors posting double digit returns. Real estate was the sole detracting sector.

The Equity Hedge, Event Driven, Relative Value, and Macro strategies generated positive returns within HFGPS. At the underlying fund level, gains were driven by two Equity Hedge funds – Skye Global and Blackrock. Negative performance from Pentwater, an event driven fund, partially offset gains.

Strategy Highlights

Event Driven

Broad Market Commentary

HFRI Event Driven strategies were positive for the quarter. The multi-strategy and special situations components were the largest contributors. Merger arbitrage was also accretive, as positive deal regulatory developments narrowed spreads and deal closings generated gains. Credit strategies were generally positive, driven by tighter credit spreads as resilient growth, better-than-expected earnings, elevated yields, and improving capital markets access supported valuations.

HFGPS Commentary

HFGPS experienced positive performance in the Event Driven strategy. Aspex, an event driven Fund focused in Asia, was the largest contributor, driven by gains from information technology and communication services exposure in the long book and consumer discretionary exposure in the short book. A diversified multi-strategy manager further contributed to performance; however, due to confidentiality, we are unable to share details on performance drivers for this fund. Pentwater detracted from performance with largely idiosyncratic losses resulting in negative performance.

Strategy Highlights

Equity Hedge

Broad Market Commentary

HFRI Equity Hedge performance was positive in Q1 2024. Positive performance was driven by the fundamental value, sector specialist and fundamental growth sub-strategies as equity markets advanced despite prevailing concerns surrounding stubborn inflation, the outlook for interest rates, and the burden of consumer and government debt.

By region, In North America, equity markets advanced despite prevailing concerns surrounding stubborn inflation, the outlook for interest rates, and the burden of consumer and government debt. By sector, positive performance was widespread, with 10 of 11 sectors of the S&P 500 advancing. Notably, gains were led by Technology stocks, which were largely driven by continued excitement surrounding Artificial Intelligence. Real Estate was the only sector that detracted from performance.

Asian markets were positive, apart from China and Thailand. Chinese markets struggled from a continued economic slowdown and rising geopolitical tensions between the U.S. and China. Markets partially recovered losses in February and March, fueled by strong economic data during the Lunar New Year, policy support, and government-backed funds investing in major index ETFs. Japanese equities rallied, with strong macro data, higher wage expectations supporting domestic consumption, and better-than-expected Q4 2023 earnings driving outperformance. The Bank of Japan exited an 8-year-long Negative Interest Rate Policy (“NIRP”) in March, marking a significant turning point in monetary policy. Indian equity markets experienced modest gains. GDP growth and foreign inflows offset a historically weak seasonal trend.

HFGPS Commentary

HFGPS experienced positive performance in the Equity Hedge strategy. All funds within this strategy generated positive performance in Q1. Blackrock was the top contributor with gains driven by long positions in industrial cyclicals, defensives, and consumer cyclicals. Skye Global further contributed to performance with mega-cap technology exposure in the Fund’s long book.

Strategy Highlights

Macro

Broad Market Commentary

HFR Macro strategies generated positive performance in the first quarter. The systematic diversified component was a notable contributor to fund performance. Within macro strategies, strong positive performance was driven by tactically trading developed market fixed income with a short bias, particularly in the U.S. and Europe, with curve steepening biases. During Q1 2024, markets priced out central bank rate cuts due to continued strong economic data and stickier-than-expected inflation. Short positioning in Japanese rates was also accretive, as the Bank of Japan further loosened the band on policy rates and indicated additional policy changes in the future. Long gold positioning generated positive performance amid heightened geopolitical uncertainty. Within currencies, long the U.S. dollar versus Chinese renminbi was accretive. Gains were partially offset by losses from select managers positioned long front-end rates in the U.S. and Europe, who expected rate cuts early in Q1 2024.

HFGPS Commentary

HFGPS Macro allocations posted positive returns on average. Alphadyne Global was the largest contributor to performance, driven by directional and relative value trading during the quarter. Element further contributed to performance, driven by the rates and currencies strategies. Brevan Howard was the sole detractor from performance as the fund experienced losses within their rates strategies.

Strategy Highlights

Relative Value

Broad Market Commentary

The performance of HFRI Relative Value hedge funds was positive with gains driven by the fixed income sub-strategy, followed by the arbitrage and multi-strategy sub-strategies. Within macro fixed income relative value, gains were driven from cross-market trading themes, short positioning in Asian currencies, and long gold positioning. The micro fixed income and merger arbitrage relative value strategies were also accretive, as positive deal regulatory developments narrowed spreads and deal closings generated gains for the merger arbitrage strategy, while a strong bond basis opportunity set in the U.S. and Japan proved to be accretive for the micro fixed income relative value strategy.

HFGPS Commentary

HFGPS experienced positive performance in the Relative Value strategy. All underlying Funds within this strategy generated gains in the first quarter. Point72 was the top contributor, driven by the fund's discretionary long/short equities strategy, systematic strategies, global macro strategy, and external investments. Woodline further contributed to performance driven by long positions in healthcare companies.

HFRI Fund Weighted Composite Index is a global, equal-weighted index of single-manager funds that report to HFR Database. Constituent funds report monthly net of all fees performance in U.S. Dollar and have a minimum of \$50 Million under management or \$10 Million under management and a twelve (12) month track record of active performance. Annualized Standard Deviation is a statistical measure of the degree to which an individual value in a probability distribution tends to vary from the mean of the distribution. It is widely applied to Modern Portfolio Theory for example, where the past performance of securities is used to determine the range of possible future performances and a probability is attached to each performance. The standard deviation of performance can then be calculated for each security and for the portfolio as a whole. The greater the dispersion, the greater the risk.

Sharpe Ratio is the amount of reward per unit of risk. The higher the Sharpe Ratio, the more incremental return is added per increase in risk as measured by standard deviation.

Beta is the measure of a fund’s volatility relative to the market. A beta of greater than 1.0 indicates that a fund is more volatile than the market, and less than 1.0 is less volatile than the market. For example, if the market rises 1% and a fund has a beta equal to 2.5, then such fund is likely to rise faster than the market (and conversely fall faster than the market when the market falls).
